The Administrative Ministry Team met on July 17, 2018. Present were the following: Doug Greenburg, Jim Ingram, Kenny Wade, Roxann Leo, Kourtney Shewmaker and Patsy King.

1: Property report: Kenny Wade reported he was getting bids for the concrete work in front of the new child day care center. He reported that the security system has been installed on the handicap door to the church. He reported that handicap door latch has been repaired and will open automatically by pushing the handicap button.

2: Financial report: Patsy King reported the offering to this date is approximately \$1800 better than last year at this time. However, the offering is approximately \$19,000 behind budget.

Jim Ingram reviewed the Permanent Fund policy as to undesignated "gifts" to the Church in the form of a bequest, etc. and pursuant to the permanent fund policy approved by the general board on November 7, 2004. All undesignated gifts to the church shall become the property of the Permanent Fund.

3: Security report: Kenny Wade reported that wiring still need to be installed to the side door of the church and to the Tic Toc door to connect the security system to those two doors.

4: Church directory: July 30 is the last scheduled day to have pictures taken for the church directory. If anyone has any questions contact Roxann.

5: New business: AT&T has offered to bundle their services for phone and the internet for \$155 per month versus \$214 per month that we're paying now. Roxann was authorized to negotiate with AT&T on this matter. Addendum: Due to the protective measures that Kenneth Tubaugh installed for the internet AT&T was unable to bundle our services. According to AT&T workers Kenneth installed a better system than what AT&T has to offer.

First Baptist Church is celebrating their 155th anniversary and is asking other churches to place ads in their celebration program. Ads are full page \$25 and ½ page \$15. The committee voted to do a half page ad for \$15. Roxann will contact Almetra Taylor with First Baptist Church and let her know we will participate.

Next AMT meeting day: The committee decided to not have a regular schedule meeting in August unless it is necessary to call a special meeting. The next meeting date is September 11, 2018 at 5 PM.
