Gratitude was the rope someone threw me to climb out of my pit of darkness and grief. An older friend recognized my struggle and threw me the rope by asking me what I was grateful for. In the beginning I could not name many things that I was grateful for—so he named them for me. Eventually I was able to recognize and see and name the many, abundant, overflowing blessings in my life. Not one material thing changed. My perspective, my ability to see and recognize the hand of God at work in the world and in my life grew.

Gratitude is powerful because it recognizes The Giver of all that is good; it bows before The God who is our loving Creator, Sustainer, Redeemer, Savior and Friend.

This November may we find gratitude powerful in our lives. May we count our blessings – and name them one by one – count our many blessings, see what God has done.

In the foyer of our sanctuary this November, we will have a Thanksgiving frame where everyone can write and name the abundance of things you are grateful for...one by one.

AMT meeting was held October 11th.

Kenny Wade reported that the Cecil Brothers had offered a bid of \$4,900 to rebuild the sidewalk in front of the Comp Care building. APS is still waiting for a compressor part for the ice machine. Once received it will take about a week to remove, repair and replace the ice machine. Most everything else in the church were minor items.

Kay Richardson gave the Treasurer's Report for September month end. General Offering continues a downward trend. We are -18.5% or (\$36,941) versus budget and we are down -6.5% or (\$11,346) versus last year which was a difficult year. On the positive side our expenses have been reduced due to gaps and transitions to new staff and the ministry teams have been holding down expenses. 2017 will be a different year because of full staffing, possible no income from the Comp Care building and continued downward trend of offerings.

Roxann Leo, Barbara Yeast and David Leo have presented a revised Wedding Policy which will be used going forward. It was designed to be more in line with other churches in our community.

AMT members will be meeting with our Ministry Team leaders to review 2016 budget and prepare 2017 budget for presentation to the November General Board meeting.

Discussions were held to consider a new church directory. Our last directory was published in 2011.

We have signed a contract with Gibson & Company from Lexington to handle the listing to lease the Comp Care building. The building was available as of 10/1/16. This also means that we have lost this important income source from this building. Hopefully we can find a suitable tenant quickly.

Discussion was held about having Mission First work with the Property Team to address numerous church interior needs.

The next meeting is November 15, 2016.
