MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD CHAIR

We are asking the congregation to help us out with our budget shortfall. Offerings are down 19% (\$30,000) and other income is off 60% (\$20,000 from last year to date) due in large part to Comp Care Building being vacant this year.

85% of our expenses are fixed with personnel, buildings and maintenance. 15% is related to our Ministry Teams. Everyone is being a good steward with our budgets. We have adjusted our expectations and budgets to the shortfalls, but that is not enough to meet the growing needs of our congregation and community.



Corrie Ten Boom was a Dutch watchmaker who became a heroine of the Resistance, a survivor of Hitler's concentration camps, and one of the most remarkable evangelists of the twentieth century. In World War II she and her family risked their lives to help Jews and underground workers escape from the Nazis, and for their work they were tested in the infamous Nazi death camps. Only Corrie among her family survived to tell the story of how faith ultimately triumphs over evil.

Administrative Ministry Team met on Tuesday, Aug. 8, 2017.

Present at the meeting were Doug Greenburg, Jim Ingram, Bo Baxter, Phil Richardson, Kenny Wade, Kourtney Shewmaker, Kathy Lester, Stephen Toon, and Gaye Haralu.

- 1. Property report from Kenny Wade: reported ceiling tiles have fallen down in the hallway next to the fellowship room. Discussed repairing the front doors prior to having them painted. Kenny reported the front of the church and other areas would be painted in September or October.
- 2. Financial report: Jim Ingram reported we were \$29,000 under budget for our offering but \$5000 more has been given than this time last year.
- 3. Church directory update: The directory is placed on hold until the two music positions are filled.
- 4. Comp care building update: No immediate prospects at this time. There was discussion of possibly subdividing the building in order to get it rented.
- 5. New business:
- A. Dan Chilton spoke on the mission trip to India and Nagaland to build an orphanage. There are no exact figures as to what it would cost per person or the church for this mission work and trip. This matter was tabled until further information on the exact costs can be determined. The proposed trip would take place in September 2018. The preliminary cost estimated would be between \$3000 and \$5000 possibly for the church and \$2000 per member to make the trip. The exact costs cannot be determined until the trip is completed according to Danny.
- B. Tic Toc lease: the rental amount was discussed at the committee meeting. It is estimated that the rent is \$350 per month now. There is a possibility we would consider raising the rent. Phil Richardson is to discuss this matter with Jackie Merriman.
- C. The cost of Worship and Wonder Sunday school program was discussed. Gaye reported that the cost of this program to teach Sunday school would not affect our budget. However, Bry may use all of the Sunday school expenditure which is now \$1,800.
- D. The AMT committee agreed to allow Rotary club to use its computer during the Rotary meetings due to the fact that other computers do not work well with the church's speaker system and the projector.
- E. Mulch is needed for the playground prior to beginning of the Tic Toc's new season. It is recommended that Missions First and the property committee address this issue.
- F. There is a candidate for a piano/organ position. If the pianist is hired she would begin August 27, 2017.
- G. Next AMT meeting is set for September 21 at 6 PM.
