Pew Chatter

Dear Friends at HCC.

March 1st is Ash Wednesday, marking the beginning of Lent—and I just finished putting away my Christmas decorations! Somehow time marches on whether we are "ready' or not. I am grateful for the seasons of the church that call us to remember what is most important.

This year, I believe Lent is unmistakably calling us. This tangible time and opportunity which God has used in the lives of disciples since biblical times is available to remind us of God's work in our lives. Lent is calling us into deeper relationship with God. Lent is an invitation from God to grow. I am especially grateful for the experiential nature of the season: the ashes, the colors, the giving up of something dear, the taking on of something new, the focus on intentionally journeying with Jesus.

John of the Cross was a Spanish mystic in the service of the Catholic Reform in 1567 and was responsible for beginning many new orders under the direction of Teresa of Avila. He was arrested and put in prison by those who believed differently. In this place he wrote his most famous work, "Dark Night of the Soul." Just a couple of quotes seem especially meaningful in association with Lent.

"There will come a time when God will bid them to grow deeper. God will remove the previous consolation from the soul in order to teach it virtue and prevent it from developing vice...Let it suffice to say then, that God perceives the imperfections within us, and because of his love for us, urges us to grow up. God's love is not content to leave us in our weakness, and for this reason He takes us into a dark night. God weans us from all of the pleasures by giving us dry times and inward darkness."

In Lent we can offer ourselves to God in order to grow and trust that God will be faithful to that request. May we together as the community of Harrodsburg Christian Church be willing to grow into deeper fellowship with Jesus? Every Sunday in Lent, prayer stations will be available in the sanctuary, at 10:15 a.m. prior to the worship service, to walk us through this journey of reflection and preparation for growth. With disciplined devotion and expectation let us enter this special season of Lent.

The Administrative Ministry Team met on February 16, 2017. The following were present Doug Greenburg, Phil Richardson, Kenny Wade, Kathy Lester, Roxann Leo, Kourtney Shewmaker, Bo Baxter, Jim Ingram, Phil Williams and Glen Culbertson.

The following reports were given:

Property: Kenny Wade reported the big boiler was unhooked and there were no other major issues with the church at this time.

Financial report: Jim Ingram reported on the financial condition and the budget. He indicated giving was running approximately 3% behind what was given last year. He indicated that overall we were \$136.12 better than budget for the month of January. He noted administrative ministry was over budget by about \$800.

Church directory update: Roxann reported that she needs more members to form an ad hoc committee to proceed to start contacting companies about at church directory. Phil Richardson said he would serve on that committee along with Glen Culbertson. However they still need more members.

Comp care building update: Phil reported there is furniture in the building for sale to church members first. He indicated there's been no interest in the comp care building. He plans to meet with Dick Webb with the industrial board to see if he would help in finding a renter.

New business:

Glen Culbertson spoke at the meeting and gave an update on the condition of the playground. He told what needs to be done and various proposals. One proposal will be total replacement of the equipment but would be very expensive. Number two- refurbish the existing poles and replace what needs to be done underground. Other new business: voted and approved spending \$100 to repair the computer in the fellowship hall.

Discussed Roxann's computer in her office and this matter was tabled for two months for further study.

Life Line Screening: the committee approved allowing lifeline screening to use the church during the month of June for one day. This will be set up by Roxann.

It was noted that vacation Bible school is going to be July 17 through the 22nd.
