Administrative Ministry Team met on Sept. 21. Present at the meeting on September 21,2017 were the following: Doug Greenburg, Jim Ingram, Bo Baxter, Phil Richardson, Kenny Wade, Kathy Lester, and Roxann Leo.

- 1. Property report: Kenny Wade reported that there are plans to put mulch on the church's playground area September 30. He will order 15 yards of mulch at a cost of \$550 to be delivered. He also indicated there are issues with one of the sump pumps in the church basement.
- 2. Financial report: Jim Ingram reported we were approximately \$24,000 under budget. On the positive side, the offering was above average for the month of August.

AMT committee discussed the Music Academy designated fund of having a balance of \$2,107.73 and since all expenses have been paid that amount will be moved to the Other Income account.

Breast cancer is the second most common kind of cancer in women, About 1 in 8 women born today in the United States will get breast cancer at some point. The good news is that most women can survive breast cancer if it's found and treated early.



- If you are a woman age 40 to 49, talk with your doctor about when to start getting mammograms and how often to get them.
- If you are a woman age 50 to 74, be sure to get a mammogram every 2 years. You may also choose to get them more often.

Talk to a doctor about your risk for breast cancer, especially if a close family member of yours had breast or ovarian cancer. Your doctor can help you decide when and how often to get mammograms.
