



ADMINISTRATIVE MINISTRY TEAM

Present at the Administrative Ministry Team meeting on October 17, 2017 where the following: Doug Greenburg, Phil Richardson, Phil Williams, Jim Ingram, Roxann Leo, Kathy Lester, Kourtney Shewmaker, and Gaye Haralu.

1: Property report: painting will begin at the church next week.

2: Financial report: Jim Ingram reported we are still behind budget for the year. However, general offering is about \$17,000 better than last year at this time. The expenses of the church exceed our income by approximately \$6,000.

3: Church directory: There's been no activity on the church directory. Waiting for the employment of a music director.

4: Comp Care building: Phil Richardson met with Leo Mayo on behalf of Christian Life Center but we're unable to come to terms.

5: Music director position: still looking for someone to fill that position.

6: Tic Toc lease: Phil Richardson met with Jackie Merriman who operates Tic Toc, and they came to terms on another year's lease at the rate of \$225.00 per month rent. Phil stated next year the rent would increase.

New business: Phil Richardson and Jim Ingram presented a proposed budget for 2018. However, there are expected to be some changes made before it is finalized. The proposed budget is approximately 5% less than current year's budget.

Nagaland trip to India: Dan Chilton presented information on the purposed Nagaland trip and the expected cost and expense. It is estimated it would cost each person that goes on the trip approximate \$2,500. Addition expense of building new homes for the orphanage would be approximately \$2,000 for each house built. The propose date for the trip would be July or October 2018.

Gaye Haralu discussed with the committee that Mariam Smith is interested in being allowed to give piano lessons in the church. It was decided that additional information was needed such as: what day of the week she would use the church and time before permission would be granted. It was also discussed if this would affect our insurance and any agreement would be only for a limited period of time and then we would review the agreement.
