We all experience some apprehension and anxiety anytime we shift into a new season in our life. As a nation we are preparing for a major shift as we move closer to November 5, electing our 47th president of the United States. Many of us hold some apprehension and anxiety over what this new season will look like. We've already been experiencing growing tension, division and discord. As people of faith, we are challenged with how we will respond and how we will choose to live in such times as this.

The identity of Harrodsburg Christian Church is woven deeply around the welcoming and inclusive love of God we know through the life and ministry of Jesus. We seek to be a presence of God's inclusive love in our own lives, in our community and in the world. I am, like you, sometimes wondering how to be God's presence of love during this challenging time. Where I stand on the political and theological spectrum is different than some of my family members and friends. Sometimes table conversations can feel strained. I get the tension many of us are living in.

As we move through these next couple of months, I invite you to be present in worship. We are finishing up our worship series on Linked in Love. We will build on knowing we are connected and that we are not alone on this journey. In September and October our worship experiences will offer us encouragement as well as some challenges, as we seek to be the people God calls us to be.

In September we will be using Sanctified Art's worship series "I've Been Meaning to Ask...a series for curiosity, courage and connection." Some of our best conversations start with good questions—questions we've been meaning to ask, questions that keep us curious, and questions that lead us deeper into courage and connection. Starting September 8 through September 29, we will look at four different guiding guestions. Sept. 6: Where are you from? Sept. 15: Where does it hurt? Sept 22: What do you need? Sept. 29: Where do we go from here? As you can see the questions are not surface level. We will be encouraged to tell our stories, share pain, care for one another and dream about a new way forward together. This series will help us to behold each other as images of the Divine, strengthen us for empathy and compassion, remind us of the power of unassuming questions and show us that courage is rooted in the 6 heart.


